## **Preliminary Conference Programme**

The Annual Conference Programme is currently been created. At this stage we would like to provide you with the general overview of the programme.

## Wednesday, 8<sup>th</sup> of October 2014

ILGA-Europe and Mozaika will welcome the participants at the **Opening reception** on the evening before the official beginning of the Conference. The opening reception will feature **special guests.** .

## Thursday, 9th of October 2014

The first day of the Conference will start with an **Opening Morning** during which we will look back on developments that the European LGBTI Movement has seen since the last conference. The opening will feature a panel which will include speeches by ILGA-Europe's co-chairs, **Gabi Calleja and Paulo Côrte-Real**. The opening will also include a new feature of the Conference called **QueerEd Talk**. During the QueerEd Talk an opinion maker from the European human rights movement will address the audience, providing an introduction to the Conference theme. A **High-level panel discussion** will bring together this year's keynote speakers in reflecting on successes and challenges of the European LGBTI movement. Confirmed keynote speakers are: **Graeme Reid** (Director of the LGBT Programme at Human Rights Watch), **Eliza Byard** (Executive Director of the Gay, Lesbian and Straight Education Network), **Charles Radcliffe** (senior UN human rights adviser on sexual orientation and gender identity) and **Helena Dalli** (Maltese Civil Liberties Minister).

During all of the Conference days various **workshops** carried out by the participants and ILGA-Europe's team will take place. Workshops will address many different issues relevant to the Conference theme and to the European LGBTI movement in general, such as: reflecting on recent **policies** achieved and **strategies** developed by the LGBTI movement;





practices and theories of achieving social and political changes (capacity building workshop on); communication as tool for achieving change (capacity building workshop on); workshops on specific issues (e.g. intersex, employment, sex workers, etc.); and much more.

As according to tradition, at the Annual Conference the **Annual General Meeting** of ILGA-Europe's Member Organisations will take place, during which, amongst others, the ILGA-Europe and ILGA Executive Board are elected.

Accompanying the formal programme, there will also be many **informal activities** taking place throughout the Conference. Participants will be able to schedule **self-organized meetings** on the topics of their specific interests. During women caucus women related issues will be discussed in a safe environment. There will be the possibility of attending a **women evening party**, a **city tour** as well as to **visit an on-venue exhibition**. The Conference will come to an end with a **gala dinner** outside of the Conference venue, followed by a **closing party** ...
